LAUNCH OF THE BRIDGE FUND

With generous support from the VF Foundation, we launched the Bridge Fund to help HALI students cover transition costs that prevent them from unlocking hard-earned scholarship awards.

The Bridge Fund covers transition costs such as visa fees, passports, flights and other one-off expenses often excluded from financial aid/scholarship packages.

2024 Highlights...

In 2023, our annual survey showed that 25 HALI students received admission to university with full financial aid but could not enroll due to the inability to afford transition costs. We are mobilizing funds to support our students in closing these gaps, which are considerably small compared to the hundreds of thousands they've already worked hard for and earned in scholarship support.

In 2024, the fund bridged that gap for 11 students who travelled to their new campus communities at Smith College, MIT, Soka University of America, and Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, among other institutions. The Bridge Fund has enabled our students to collectively unlock \$921,616.39 in financial aid annually.

The need for connections lies at the heart of why the HALI Access Network is essential for education access. We bring together professionals from around the world and both sides of the admissions desk to support African HALI students to pursue their higher education goals.



The <u>9th annual Indaba in Rwanda</u> brought together 75 education access advocates – 39 access organizations, 22 universities, and partners – to discuss the theme "Global Learners, Local Leaders."


